PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Welcome to the 110th Annual Wisconsin State Shoot. As most everyone knows, the sport of trapshooting has not been immune to the effects of the recent economic downturn. Nationally, registered trapshooting was down over 11% last year and most State Shoots were down between 15 and 20%. Through the tremendous efforts of our sponsors, volunteers, the WTA Board of Directors and the trapshooters of Wisconsin, our State Shoot saw a decline of only 7.5%. In order to maintain an enjoyable and high quality shoot, target fees have reluctantly been increased this year to \$29.00 per 100. Daily admission fees of (ATA \$2.00 and WTA \$3.00) will be added to your first entry of the day. In addition, Wisconsin Sales Tax of 5.1% will be added to all entries and daily admission fees.

In 2009, the WTA will be implementing the 3s Shooting Sports Software for our State Shoot. With everyone's cooperation and so that this shoot may be run as smoothly and as efficiently as possible, please read the updated entry procedure on page 3 of this program.

I just wanted to give you an update on the Recreational and Training Park (WTA Homegrounds). We are currently waiting to hear from the Internal Revenue Service as to whether we will be allowed to become a 501c3 organization. This takes time and hopefully we will have an announcement before or at our annual meeting. The WTA Annual Meeting will begin at 8:00 A.M. Friday on the East end of the grounds. Please remember to bring your 2008 ATA membership card and proof that you have shot for at least 2 years so that you may vote for your ATA Delegate and Alternate Delegates.

We also will be meeting with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resource Board and State Legislators at the State Capitol on May 6th or 7th to discuss our mission. We are being recognized and talked about at the state level with positive thoughts and ideas and we strive for this to continue.

I hope to see you at our State Shoot this July and maybe even before then. Continue to enjoy our sport as much as possible and I wish you much success. Please support your local clubs and take a kid shooting.

The Directors of the W.T.A. reserve the right to change the program as conditions warrant and to reject any entry without explanation. The entire program is conducted by the W.T.A. The Waukesha Gun Club provides the facility. In the event of trap break downs or other circumstances which could impede the progress of this shoot, the Directors of the W.T.A. reserve the right to move squads to other than their starting locations to efficiently expedite the completion of events. In the event of a dispute over interpretation of this program, the decision of the Directors of the W.T.A. shall govern.

W.T.A. Zero Tolerance Policy—There will be zero tolerance of any shooter or observer interfering with the shoot by abusing any shooter, WTA Director, Officer, or employee in any way; unauthorized operation of equipment or partaking of alcoholic beverages prior to shooting, including shoot offs. This behavior will result in an immediate automatic request to leave the grounds, disqualification of scores, and forfeiture of any entry fees paid. This will be enforced!

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Participants in this Championship Tournament must be current members of the Amateur Trapshooting Association (ATA) and meet the following minimum target requirements:

Shooters not meeting the minimum requirements will be assigned at a minimum, the class and/or yardage shown in the table below, based on their gender or special category declaration(s). Shooters with 16 yard and/or doubles averages at or exceeding the minimum penalty class will be penalized a minimum of one class. Shooters with current handicap yardage at or exceeding the minimum penalty yardage will be penalized a minimum of two yards, not to exceed 26.5 yards.

Penalty class and/or yardage will apply to all events. Tuesday's preliminary targets may be used to meet the minimum requirements.

CLASSIFICATION

It is the shooters responsibility to see they are properly classified and handicapped. Failure to do so will result in disqualification and/or suspension. All shooters will be subject to review prior to shoot offs or awarding of trophies or purses.

Champion, Runner-up, Class Champions, ties and high scores in each class from the 2008 State Championship events will be advanced a minimum of one class for this shoot. Class Champions, ties and high scores in each class in Wednesday's Class Doubles and Thursday's Class Singles will be advanced one class for the remainder of this shoot. Class moves will be done for both residents and non-residents.

Classification will be according to known ability; the following will be taken into consideration:

- ◆ Official averages, Registered League average (abnormally low scores will be disregarded.)
- ◆ Non-Registered scores, including shoot off scores, non-registered events, practice scores etc.
- ◆ Any other information known on shooters ability.
- ◆ Omission of scores and inaccuracies subject shooters to disqualification

NOTICE: The Handicap Committee reserves the right to change a shooters classification at any time. Any changes made by the Classification Committee during this shoot become official when the shooter is notified or when posted on the scoreboard. Errors may be corrected at any time. If you gain yardage you must check at the Squading Table to see if you need resquading for the remaining handicap events.

ENTRY PROCEDURE - NEW IN 2009 - PLEASE READ

The grounds will be open at noon on Monday, July 13 for classification, squading, cashiering, exhibitor set-up and camper set-up.

Before you can make any entries, you must be a current A.T.A. member. If you need an A.T.A. membership or renewal, go directly to the cashier's counter. The WTA has changed to the 3S Shooting Sports Software for our State Shoot. As such, you are now required to have your plastic ATA card for classifying, squading, cashiering and the collection of event payoffs. In order to expedite the shoot, please follow the entry procedure in the following order:

1. Classification - All shooters, whether pre-squaded or not, must start at classification. Present your plastic ATA card and ATA paper average card to a member of the Classification Committee at the classification table. Please have your average card up to date! They will enter your classification, yardage and any special category for which you declare into the computer system. If you do not have a plastic ATA card or ATA number, then the computer will assign you a Shooter Number. Otherwise your ATA Number is your Shooter Number. Do not misplace this number as it will be required for squading and cashiering.

2. Squading - If you have pre-squaded for this shoot at presquad.com, you may proceed directly to the cashier's counter. Otherwise, proceed to the squading table and stand in the line for the event(s) that you wish to enter. Present your plastic ATA card or Shooter Number to the squading personnel. They will enter your squading information into the computer system. You will not receive any paper entry cards. Shooters **must** take the next available position or squad available in the squading line. There is a limit of one full squad per shooter per event. There will be no exceptions except for those shooters that are handicapped. Any shooter or group of shooters found trying to circumvent these procedures by requesting multiple squads and/or positions will have their entries refused and could be subject to further disqualification from an event or from the entire tournament. To ensure your shooting times and positions, the use of presquad.com is recommended.

Please note: The trapline is arranged into fourteen (14) banks of trapfields with fourteen starting points. Bank A is at the West end and Bank G at the East end of the trap line. 50 targets will be shot per trap for all singles, handicap and doubles events. Charts showing the starting locations for squad numbers will be made available and posted about the grounds.

3. Cashiering - Present your plastic ATA card or Shooters Number to personnel at the cashier's counter. They will ask which purses and options that you wish to play. Please make this decision in advance, as no additions or withdrawals will be allowed for any event after you have cashiered. Checks will be accepted for the amount of shooting fees only. Make checks payable to the WTA. No two party checks or endorsements. A \$25.00 fee will be charged on all bad checks. There are no refunds unless an event is cancelled.

Junior Entry: Shooters under 18 years of age are offered targets at a reduced rate of \$22.00 per 100 providing no purses or options are played. These Juniors are still eligible for trophies and added money if their score so qualifies them.

4. Event Payoffs - You must present your plastic ATA card or Shooters Number to cashier personnel in order to receive any event payoffs. Announcements will be made or posted daily as to the availability of payoffs. All payoffs not made at the shoot will be mailed within 10 days.

THE CASHIER'S COUNTER WILL OPEN AT 7:30 AM and CLOSE AT 5:00 PM DAILY

SQUAD HUSTLING

Check in with the squad hustler at your starting trap and sign in on your squad sheet at the starting trap scorer's bench. At each of the starting locations, the number of the squad which is actually shooting is posted on the scorers bench and the master squad boards.

WE DO NOT CALL SQUAD NUMBERS ON THE PA SYSTEM

No shooter will be allowed to make up more than one (1) sub-event on the practice trap.

Note: If you are unable to join your squad before they have started their second sub-event, you must be resquadded and pay a \$20.00 resquadding fee. If you miss one sub-event, you must report to a W.T.A. Director and make up the sub-event on a practice trap.

TARGET SETTING

Targets will be set each morning, only authorized W.T.A. personnel may reset targets. Any unauthorized person observed resetting targets, may be disqualified from that event.

ALL W.T.A. DIRECTORS ARE OFFICIAL LINE REFEREES

SHOOT OFFS

A shooter will be awarded, or shoot-off for if tied, the trophy that is highest on the trophy importance list if their score qualifies them for it. The order of importance for W.T.A. trophies is; Champion, Runner-up, Class or Yardage Group, then Special Categories. The order of importance for A.T.A. trophies is; Champion, Runner-up, Special Category, then Class or Yardage.

Category Shooters - any category shooter who is tied for event Champion may shoot off or carryover for Champion only.

A. Shooters failing in the Champion shoot off or carryover may elect to do only one of the following two options:

B. Any category shooter who is high or tied for place, class or yardage group and also high or tied in his/her category, may elect to do only one of the following two option:

Option 1 - Take outright or shoot off or carryover for place, class or yardage group trophy, forfeiting any category trophy.

Option 2 - Take outright or shoot off or carryover for his/her category trophy, forfeiting any place, class or yardage group trophy. Shooters that have declared more than one category must choose only one category and may not fall back to another category.

In the case of more than one category, shoot management shall prioritize and declare, if required, as follows:

1. Sub Junior or Junior over Lady
2. Lady over Veteran or Senior Veteran
3. Chairshooter over all

Category shooters can shoot off for resident category trophies and then fall back to open category trophies if their score allows.

If a contestant chooses to accept a lesser award for which he/she has qualified, he/she must notify shoot management within 15 minutes of the posting of the event's final results, or at the start of the shoot-offs. Once any declarations have been made either by a shooter or shoot management, the declaration is final and can not be changed.

Note: No Shooter may win more than one trophy per event, except the concurrent awards of Husband/Wife, Parent/Child and Club Team Championship

A.T.A. RULE, SPECIAL CATEGORIES: All ladies, juniors, sub-juniors, veterans and senior-veterans must declare their eligibility when being classified. Without this declaration, the shooter will not be allowed to compete for such special prizes. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Age based special category declarations are determined by the shooters age at the beginning of the target year. Shooters who become eligible for a new age based categories during the target year may elect to continue to compete in the previous category for the remainder of that target year. However, once a shooter has elected to move to the new category that decision is irrevocable and he/she may not again declare eligibility for the previous category. Junior shooters reaching the age of 18 may continue to declare Junior category for the remainder of the current target year.

PRACTICE TRAPS

Practice will be available each day at the east end of the trap line on permanent trap 1. Tickets must be purchased at trap 1 and are not refundable if not used. The cost is \$5.00 per 25 targets. Make your entry at the practice traps. Practice times will be posted and announced each day.

ATTENDANCE PINS

Attendance pins will be issued to contestants at the classification table. Your average card will be punched or marked upon receipt of pin. Please, only one pin per shooter. If there are extras at the end of the shoot, they will be made available at that time.
