

The Daytona Beach Baby Grand

February 19, 20 & 21

The Shoot opened on Thursday morning, February 19th, with 63 Shooters. It was a beautiful day, and in fact, one of the prettiest days so far during the Chain.

When the smoke cleared away, S. W. Seybold of Marienville, Pennsylvania, and Byron Williams from Houston, Texas, who was down fishing in an adjoining County, were tied for high place. In the shoot-off, Seybold won.

Ruth Ray of Eugene, Oregon, was high woman shooter with 187x200. As a matter of fact, she had Cal and the rest of the top-notchers very much worried.

The second day of the Shoot, we had equally as beautiful weather and another tie for high, Barney Glavin of Twin Falls, Idaho, and Francis Ellis of Jacksonville, both breaking a 195 for high. After a couple of rounds, Barney missed one, and Francis got the trophy. Mrs. Ray again broke 187 for high score.

On the morning of the third day, Francis Ellis beat the field in the doubles with 92, beating Morris Ray of John Day, Oregon, by a couple of targets. Then came the Calcutta, which Bob Graham in his usual efficient manner, auctioned off. About this time, something else happened. The only way we will ever understand how it happened is that Henry Marsh brought it down from the East. A cold, chilly, foggy blanket came in from off the ocean, and from 84 degrees of beautiful sunny weather, one of the nastiest afternoons for shooting developed.

Of course, this had to happen at the time of the Handicap, and as usual, some slicker who had a lot of experience won. John Taylor, shooting 23-yards, registered from Eustis, Florida, cleaned up with an 89. There were several 88's, among them being D. P. Tribble of Greenwood, South Carolina, Francis Ellis of Jacksonville, Florida, Ike Andrews, the old "marster" from Spartanburg, and H. R. Myers.

Francis Ellis was high over the field for three days with 567 out of 600.

There were an unusual number of shooters present, according to expecta-

tions, and a number of our old time friends were there, who did not shoot. Among them being, Frank Seibert, the old veteran of New York, who was visiting on the grounds with his old cronies. Mr. and Mrs. E. L. King, who for many years shot with us in Florida, and who have a home at Daytona Beach, were present. It will be remembered that Mrs. King, in the early 20's, won the Woman's Championship of North America, two years in succession.

Phil Schreiner of Denver, took a day off from hunting, and was present for the entire Shoot.

"Prince Albert" Romig and wife were there.

Henry Atwood and Ruth, brought their yacht up, and were living on it.

Cal and Ruth Ray were present, and had with them Cal's brother and his wife from a place in Oregon that does not exist, so a newspaperman told me, by the name of John Day.

Jim Wilson of Portland, Oregon, and his wife, were present.

Dr. Kahle and his wife of Marianville, Indiana, shot the first and last day.

Peter Schutt, who is now operating the Ormand Beach Hotel, shot the first day. That's the first time Pete has shot at a target in many years. I think Pete was the first man to ever hold a registered shoot in the State of Florida, under the auspices of a hotel. This was too many years ago to mention.

Mississippi had a nice representation at the Shoot, among them being W. D. Atterbury, Charlie Perkins, and J. W. Erwin and wife.

C.E. Huber and wife, shot through the Shoot, and left immediately after the last shot was fired for home, being the last of the famous Ohio Bacardi contingent, who visited Cuba.

George McDermott and wife, of Waukegan, Illinois, arrived to attend the rest of the Chain.

Dr. H. N. Alford and Clyde King of

Atlanta, accompanied by their families, shot the program in the same squad with the Fairchilds from Reading, Penna.

Bill O'Shea ran a nice shoot, assisted by Arthur Cuscaden, T. R. Pitts and H. D. Avery.

Ed White Wins at Ogden, Utah Registered Shoot

Ed. White of Ogden and Clearfield won top honors Sunday March 28, at the registered shoot of the amateur Trapshooting association at the Ogden Gun Club. White tied with L. Johnson and F. Beasley in the 50-bird event but won the shoot-off.

In the shoot-off for first place White broke 24; Beasley, 23; and Johnson, 21. White also posted the best consecutive run of broken targets with 100. F. Beasley was second with 99 and Eugene McLain was third with 69.

Manager Ernie Ford reported today that the Easter program attracted shooters from all parts of Utah.

"It was the largest turnout of the history of the new Ogden Gun club," said Mr. Ford. "Trapshooting has really taken hold and promises to develop into one of the top ranking sports of the state."

Hortense Wood, state feminine champion, made her first appearance at the new club. She broke 48 out of 50 birds to top the women and to place among the leaders among the men.
