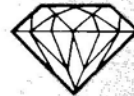

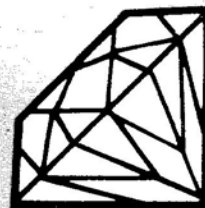

**INFORMATION. Please Read**

**WELCOME.** We welcome you to the 1974 Wisconsin Trap Tournament. We welcome constructive criticism and advice, and are always willing to explain why we do certain things certain ways.

**Qualification Requirements.** Because it is an impossibility for any handicap committee to properly handicap and classify hundreds of shooters with very little or no known record, the W.T.A. was forced to set up a set of minimum requirements for this shoot.

Note that the requirements are based on total targets shot in 1973 and 1974 combined but that at least a certain minimum number of them must have been shot in 1974. This gives the Committee some recent data to use. Shooters not meeting these requirements will be assigned the class or yardage shown in the last column below. Exceptions may be made for veterans with long established records.

Event	Tot. Req. in 1973-74	Min. Req. 1974	Class or Yardage
16 yard	800	400	Class B or higher.
Handicap	800	400	22 yards or more.
Doubles	400	200	Class C or higher.

In case of women and sub-juniors the minima will be C, 20 and D, respectively, where justified.

**Class & Yardage Changes.** Any change made by the Committee during the shoot becomes official when the shooter is notified or when posted on the bulletin board. Errors may be corrected at any time.

**Squad Hustline.** Only squad numbers will be announced on the P.A. system. No names will be called. Please check in with the hustler and then sit on the bench by your starting trap. We **cannot** wait for anyone. Shooters late for their squads will be scratched and will be squadded at the end if there is time.

**Trap Numbers.** Practice traps will be at the east end of the line. Program traps then start and run west. Trap house numbers are movable and are changed as required. For the 200 target event each squad will start on the same numbered traps for both hundreds, but those numbers will be on different houses for the two hundreds.

To determine on which trap you will start, divide your squad number by the number in the last column above (how many squads start at a time). What is left over is the number of the trap on which you will start. We'll use 28 traps Friday if enough **good** help can be found.

The 1974 Wisconsin State Trapshoot is dedicated to Alex J. (A.J.) Larsen, the Secretary-Treasurer of the W.T.A.

A. J. was born in Chicago on August 27, 1901. He worked for the Rock Island railroad at Henry, Ill., ran a trapline, and served as a guide on the Illinois river. In 1927 he started with the National Theater Supply Company, working in Chicago, New York, and then Milwaukee in 1932, becoming manager there until his retirement in 1968.

While A. J. has been associated with shooting and shooters most of his life, he has done relatively little of it. He admits to but one 25 straight in his life, with a borrowed gun at the 1946 state shoot. He last shot at the state shoot in 1970. He joined the Waukesha Gun Club in the late 30's, becoming its Secretary-Treasurer in 1943. That office was later split, but he has been Treasurer ever since. He became an A.T.A. life member in 1943.

Rarely, if ever, has a man who shot so little, showed such devotion to trapshooting. A. J. has cashiered every Wisconsin state shoot since 1941, when he became W.T.A. Secretary-Treasurer, as well as all A.T.A. zone shoots held in the state. He has also helped cashier at the Grand, and has cashiered dozens of other shoots in Wisconsin.

While much of his effort has been of the "watchdog of the treasury" type, he has also produced some original ideas. He thought up the highly successful Christmas Basket Shoot of the Waukesha Gun Club. His latest brain-child is the nature of the trophies for this year's Diamond Jubilee Anniversary Shoot. He has been planning ahead for several years for this occasion, so it is especially fitting that this shoot be dedicated to A. J., a shooter's non-shooter.

**Making Entries.** When you remember that one entry has to be made and processed every 17 seconds when 28 traps are being used, it becomes obvious that wholehearted cooperation of every shooter becomes absolutely necessary to insure smooth running and efficiency in the shoot. We have had that cooperation in the past and expect it again.

These guidelines will help both you and us:

1. Have your shoot record card up to date and accurate.
2. Have your plastic address plate with you.
3. Have your record card properly stamped by the handicap committee.
4. Know what you intend to play before you get to the cashier.
5. **Take NO entry cards from the clubhouse.**
6. Keep your entry card stub.
7. For handicaps find your squad number from the bulletin board.
8. Average your doubles and save time in the line.

Make your complete entry for any one event at one time. No "string bets" or partial withdrawals of optionals, etc., allowed. Dropouts refunded 6c per target.

Entries for following day's events will only be taken at hours specified. This is done to lighten the duties of the classification committee a bit. They have been doing a good job and we do not want to kill them off for next year.

Entry desk open **Fri. 7:30 a.m.; Sat. 7:30; Sun. 8 a.m.**

**No requests for special squadding in the handicaps will be honored. We will try to give you the starting post you ask for but make no promises. Administrative difficulties make these rules necessary.**

**Conduct of Shoot.** The entire program is conducted by the W.T.A. The Club merely provides the facilities, runs the practice traps, and has shells available. **All** rules are set by the W.T.A.

The directors of the W.T.A. reserve the right to change the program as conditions warrant and to reject any entry or refund any entry of any contestant without giving any reason. No announcements are official unless posted on the bulletin board or stated as such on the PA system.

In the event of a dispute over interpretation of any part of this program, the decision of the Directors of the W.T.A. shall govern. (They wrote it, they know what they mean.)

A.T.A. rules will govern this shoot. Entrant not having A.T.A. handicap cards will be classified and handicapped by a committee. Show your A.T.A. SCORE CARD when you register. **THIS CARD MUST BE UP TO DATE.** Erroneous cards submitted will result in disbarment from the shoot, forfeiture of trophies, etc., and will be reported to the A.T.A. and to all clubs affiliated with the W.T.A.

**Costs.** Program targets are 8c, reflecting target and labor increases. You can shoot the entire 600 target program for \$52.00 and be eligible for trophies and added money.

Added Money was allotted to the several events on the basis of number of entries in the past. On the 200 target 16 yard event and the doubles, money was allotted to classes on the same sort of basis plus the average number of targets shot by shooters in the various classes.

Added money allotted to resident and open purses based on sources and past attendance.

**Trophies.** Trophies in the three championship events are primarily for Wisconsin shooters as is to be expected, although 12 of the 61 (20 percent) of them are for non-residents or are open. That is higher than the expected percentage of nonresident shooters. All trophies Friday are wide open.

**All trophy winners Sat. & Sun. must present A.T.A. membership card when claiming trophies.**

**All Around Class Trophies.** Note that All Around trophies are being given in each of five classes. This includes the three championship events on Saturday and Sunday — 400 targets. Don't forget to obtain, fill out, and turn in a card at the bulletin board for this purpose if you have a chance. This card also covers other special awards. We are not responsible if we miss you and you turned in no card.

In all events in which trophies are given for ladies, juniors or sub-juniors, such a shooter whose score would win both that trophy and another trophy, will be given a choice between the trophies won but cannot take more than one. Such choice will be made after ties have been settled. Special A.T.A. rules apply to A.T.A. trophies.

Ties shot off the same day or as the directors rule. Absentees when shoot-offs are called forfeit. Singles shot off on 25 targets; doubles on ten pair. Some ties, where specified, are decided by reverse score — first be events, then targets, then lot.

Anyone in a shootoff report to bulletin board and give your squad number for the last event of the day. This will avoid conflicts.

The committee will apply common sense and known ability as in the past. Helpful information will be appreciated. Any protests must be in writing.

**NO SCORES CHANGED AFTER THE SHOOTER HAS FIRED AT THE FIRST TARGET AT THE NEXT POSITION. THIS IS AN A.T.A. RULE.**

**SHELLS. Shells at \$2.50 and \$2.75. They will only be sold to competitors and for use on grounds. Your entry stub will be punched.**

In any purse or option no amounts or less than \$1.00 will be figured and paid, but will be added to the next highest score instead.

**Do not park on the road.**

**Practice.** \$1.50 per round. East end.

**Trailers, Tents.** We have a fair amount of space for the parking of trailers and pitching of tents. Spaces will be assigned. Don't just "stake a claim" and be embarrassed by being asked to move. **No trailers, tents, or vehicles taking up more than one parking space will be allowed in the regular parking area. No reservations.**

**Line Taxi.** We will again operate a "line taxi" to bring shooters back from the end of the line. Please watch your small children in connection with this. **No cars allowed on the road used by the line taxi.**
